SUBJECT: APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISE LICENCE AT CHURCHILLS, 2 TONTINE STREET, FOLKESTONE, KENT, CT20 1JP.

**SUMMARY:** Report DCL/16/16 sets out the facts for the Licensing Committee to consider in determining the variation of a premise licence. The licensing committee is the Licensing Authority acting in a role formally taken by the Magistrates Court. It is therefore not appropriate for officers to make additional comments other than in the capacity as a Responsible Authority under the legislation of the Licensing Act 2003. Therefore there are no comments from Legal, Finance or other officers included in this report

#### **REASONS FOR DETERMINATION:**

The Committee is obliged to determine the application with a view of promoting the licensing objectives. In making its decision the Committee must also have regard to all the representations made and the evidence it hears. The Committee is obliged to have regard to the national guidance and the councils own licensing policy.

### **DETERMINATION:**

The Licensing Sub-Committee is asked to:

- 1. Note the contents of Report DCL/16/16.
- 2. Determine the application. The options for determining the application are set out in section 5 below.

## 1. BACKGROUND

1.1 Part 1 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that the sale or supply of alcohol on and off the premise and other licensable activities must be authorised by a premise licence..

#### 2. APPLICATION

- 2.1 An application has been made under the Licensing Act 2003 for a Variation of a Premise Licence by Mr Francis Elton of Girlings Solicitors, 16 Rose Lane, Canterbury, Kent, CT1 2UR.on behalf of the licence holder Mr Harry Thomas Chamberlain Hall, 1 Wellfield Road, Folkestone, Kent, CT20 2PJ.
- 2.2 The application is in relation to an existing Licensed Premises at Churchills, 2 Tontine Street, Folkestone, Kent, CT20 1JP.
- 2.3 A copy of the current licence is attached at Appendix 1.
- 2.4 The proposed variation is made with a view to varying the times for permitted licensable activities, and the addition of another licensable activity as follows
  - To increase the permitted Opening Hours on a Friday and Saturday only from 10.00 01.00 to 10.00 03.00.
  - To increase the permitted hours for Sale or Supply of Alcohol on and off the premise on a Friday and Saturday only from 10.00 - 00.00 to 10.00 - 02.00.
  - To increase the permitted hours for Indoor Sporting on a Friday and Saturday only from 18.00 01.00 to 18.00 02.00.
  - To increase the permitted hours for Other Similar Entertainment on a Friday and Saturday only from 11.00 00.00 to 11.00 02.00.
  - To increase the permitted hours for Late Night Refreshment on a Friday and Saturday only from 23.00 00.00 to 23.00 03.00.
  - To add the licensable activity of Recorded Music on a Friday and Saturday only from 18.00 02.00.
- 2.5 A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 2.
- 2.6 The applicant is mindful of his responsibilities and has received copies of the objections (see Appendix 3). Within the current licence he has detailed how be promotes the four licensing objectives. Any additional steps to meet these objectives following the grant of the variation are included in the application to vary the licence.
  - Please see Appendices 1 and 2 of this report.

#### 3. OBSERVATIONS

- The Committee must take such steps, as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder
  - Public Safety

- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

Any further steps the applicant intends to take to promote the four licensing objectives can been found on part **M** of the application form attached and are reflected in 2.6 above.
