BYELAW

of the good rule and government of the Borough of Folkestone made by the Council of the Borough in pursuance of section 249 of the Local Government Act, 1933, at a meeting of the Council held on the second day of February, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five.

As to the preservation of road margins laid out for ornamental purposes

(1) No person shall without lawful authority drive or place a vehicle, or cause a vehicle to be driven or placed, upon any road margin to which this byelaw applies, in such a manner as to injure or to be likely to injure any turf or any tree, shrub or plant growing thereon

Interpretation and extent of byelaw

- (2) This byelaw applies to any road margin which is:-
 - (i) in or beside a public road, including the following sections of trunk road vested in the Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation ; Hill Road, Earls Avenue from Bouverie Road West to Shorncliffe Road and Dover Road eastward of the Valiant Sailor to the Borough boundary on north side of road but not including any other trunk road in the Borough ;
 - (ii) laid or sown with grass or planted with trees, shrubs or plants, and maintained constantly in good order for ornamental purposes ; and
 - (iii) indicated to be a margin to which this byelaw applies by means of notices conspicuously displayed on or near the said margin by the Folkestone Borough Council.
- (3) *Penalty.* Every person offending against this byelaw shall be liable on summary conviction to a find not exceeding $\pounds 5$.
- (4) *Repeal.* The byelaw as to the preservation of road margins laid out for ornamental purposes which was made by the Council on 2^{nd} January, 1957, is hereby repealed.
