BYELAWS

with respect to Slaughter-houses

Town Clerk Folkestone BYELAWS made by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Folkestone acting by the Council with respect to SLAUGHTER-HOUSES in the Borough of Folkestone.

Interpretation

1. Through these byelaws the expression "the Council" means the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Folkestone acting by the Council and the expression "slaughter-house" does not include a knacker's yard.

For the licensing and registration of slaughter-houses, for keeping the same in a cleanly and proper state, for removing filth at least once in every twenty-four hours and requiring such slaughter-houses to be provided with a sufficient supply of water.

- 2. Every person who shall apply to the Council for a licence for the erection of any premises to be used and occupied as a slaughter-house shall furnish, in the form A in the schedule to these byelaws, a true statement of the particulars therein required to be specified
- 3. Every person who shall apply to the Council for a licence for the use and occupation of any premises as a slaughter-house shall furnish, in the form B in the schedule to these byelaws, a true statement of the particulars therein required to be specified.
- 4. Every person to whom the Council may have resolved that a licence be granted to erect premises for use and occupation as a slaughter-house shall be entitled to receive from the Council a licence in the form C in the schedule to these byelaws, or to the like effect.
- 5. Every person to whom the Council may have resolved that a licence be granted for the use and occupation of any premises as a slaughter-house shall be entitled to receive from the Council a licence in the form D in the schedule to these byelaws, or to the like effect.
- 6. Every person who may have obtained from the Council, in accordance with the provisions of the byelaw in that behalf, a licence to erect any premises for use and occupation as a slaughter-house, or a licence for the use and occupation of any premises as a slaughter-house shall register such premises at the office of the Council.
 - 7. Every occupier of a slaughter-house shall cause
 - (1) the means of ventilation to be kept in proper order and efficient action and in direct communication with the external air:
 - (2) the drainage to be kept in proper order and efficient action:
 - (3) every part of the internal surface of the walls and every part of the floor or pavement to be kept in good order and repair so as to prevent the absorption of any blood, refuse or filth, or of any offensive or noxious matter:
 - (4) every part of the internal surface above the floor or pavement, unless it is constructed of or covered with hard smooth impervious material and is kept properly cleansed, to be thoroughly washed with hot lime-wash at least four times in every year; that is to say, at least once during the periods between the *first* and *tenth* of *March*, the *first* and *tenth* of *June*, the *first* and *tenth* of *September*, and the *first* and *tenth* of *December* respectively, and at such other times as may be necessary for maintaining a proper state of cleanliness:

- (5) every part of the floor, pavement, and fittings, and every part of the internal surface of any wall on which any blood, refuse or filth may have been spilled or splashed, or with which any offensive or noxious matter may have been brought into contact during slaughtering or dressing, to be thoroughly washed and cleansed within *three hours* after the completion of the slaughtering or dressing:
- (6) the hide or skin, fat and offal of every slaughtered animal to be removed from the slaughter-house within *twenty-four hours* after the slaughter of the animal.
- 8. An occupier of a slaughter-house shall not
- (1) keep or cause or suffer to be kept in the slaughter-house any dog or poultry;
- (2) keep or cause or suffer to be kept in the slaughter-house any animal of which the flesh may be used for the food of man, unless it is being prepared for slaughter in the slaughter-house:
- (3) keep or cause or suffer to be kept in the slaughter-house any animal for longer than is necessary for preparing it for slaughter;
- (4) confine or cause or suffer to be confined in the slaughter-house any animal elsewhere than in proper pounds, stalls, pens or lairs.
- 9. Every occupier of a slaughter-house shall cause the slaughter-house to be provided with a water supply, kept in proper order and efficient action, and adequate for thoroughly washing and cleansing the floor or pavement, the internal surface of the walls, and every vessel or receptacle used for the collection or removal of blood, manure, garbage, filth, or refuse.
- 10. Every occupier of a slaughter-house shall
- (1) provide receptacles, properly constructed of galvanized iron or other nonabsorbent material and furnished with closely fitting covers, sufficient for collecting and removing from the slaughter-house any blood, manure, garbage, filth, or refuse.
- (2) when the slaughter of any animal or any dressing of its carcase is completed cause all blood, manure, garbage, filth, or refuse to be collected and deposited in such receptacles:
- (3) cause every vessel, receptacle, instrument or appliance belonging to and used in the slaughter-house to be thoroughly cleansed immediately after being used, and when not in use to be kept clean:
- (4) cause the contents of any vessel or receptacle containing filth to be removed from the premises at least once in every *twenty-four hours*.
- 11. A person shall not wilfully soil or defile any part of a slaughter-house.

Provided always that this byelaw shall not apply so as to prevent any person making proper use of any sanitary convenience or urinal provided in a slaughter-house.

Penalties

12. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing byelaws for the registering of slaughter-houses, for keeping the same in a cleanly and proper state, for removing filth at least once in every *twenty-four hours*, and for requiring such slaughter-houses to be provided with a sufficient supply of water, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of *five pounds*, and in the case of a continuing nuisance to a penalty of *ten shillings* for every day during which such nuisance shall be continued after the conviction for the first offence:

Provided nevertheless, that the justices or court before whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment as a penalty of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty imposed by this byelaw.

Repeal of Byelaws

13. The byelaws relating to slaughter-houses referred to in the following table are so far as they are in force in the Borough of Folkestone hereby repealed.
