

Dear Sir,



I still feel very strongly that this is the wrong thing to do. Princes Parade is part of our towns heritage, it is a unique stretch of coast road where even if the weather is awful cars can park beside the sea summer and winter and the wonderful open views can be enjoyed by all, France and the English channel on one side and across the Royal Military Canal to the town and the hills beyond on the other. The sea anglers also use this part of Hythe all year round, where they have close, easy access to their cars, very often overnight.

The plan to re-route the road alongside the Royal Military Canal will also have a devastating effect on a very well used, peaceful walk, where wildlife is abundant. The flora and fauna have chosen this area to make a home, to move it will destroy it.

The emergency services also use the road along the parade as a short cut to avoid the traffic along the very busy Seabrook road, which can often mean the difference between life and death.

I would also like to add that when it comes to planning, Folkestone town has far more councillors that can vote than Hythe, where all are against moving the road. Folkestone is a bigger town five miles away from Hythe and I would imagine that most of the population never visit Hythe. Please take this into consideration, the majority in Hythe are strongly against this plan whereas the majority of Folkestone's townspeople probably don't care- that's if they even know where Princes Parade is.

I hope that you consider this and refuse the plans to realign OUR road.
