Further to the full **Public Inquiry which** is being held on 19th October 2021 which will last for five days, I am writing to object to the Stopping Up Order that will adversely affect transport and highway issues in relation to the Princes Parade proposed development. I must clarify that this is purely a written objection.

Firstly, the seafront is extremely popular and many visitors park their cars at the side of the road along the seafront leading to the Hythe Imperial Hotel. The proposed development will seriously affect their access, convenience and enjoyment.

Secondly, the seafront is an amenity which is enjoyed by many people both for access and recreational purposes. Furthermore, people with disabilities will be greatly inconvenienced in terms of a lack of access.

Additionally, the effect on traffic will be devastating and is highly likely to lead to congestion along the main road from Seabrook to Hythe, causing tailbacks towards Sandgate and Folkestone.
