Further to my heartfelt objections on the stopping up of Princes Parade submitted on 18/05/2018 I would like to add

Following the amount of housing development on the Shorncliffe site to the north of Seabrook the A259 is already experiancing considerable increase in traffic. The A259 through Seabrook is very narrow due to the amount of on street parking as many residents do not have garages, this means the road is not wide enough for 2 large vehicles such as buses and lorries, to pass each other. The stopping up of Princes Parade is going to add considerably to the congestion and risk of accidents on this part of the A259.

The siting of the proposed new road running within 13.32 metres of the canal contravenes the Environment Agency's reccommendations and will increase noise and pollution for the many people who walk the canal path on a daily basis and for the considerable amount of local wildlife both on the canal and in the surrounding areas. Much of the canal bank habitat will be destroyed by the building of this road and the engineering work required to provide support for a road on this land directly above the canal.

I do not believe the stopping up of Princes Parade and the damage it will cause is justified or necessary in order to provide a new swimming pool and leisure centre on this site.
