My name is Hannah, I live in Seabrook and I am 14 years old.

A short while ago, I wrote to Folkestone and Hythe District Council and invited the Councillors to walk along the banks of The Royal Military Canal and see why this unique place is so special from a young persons point of view.

How many do you think bothered to reply – yes, you guessed it – all Green, Labour and Liberal Democrat Councillors, but just one patronising response from a Conservative Councillor. It's a shame certain members of the Council don't listen or bother to respond to the young residents of the area.
