I have already submitted my detailed opposition to this development to FHDC as it is unacceptable and creates significant harm. However, it seems that FHDC is determined to undermine the wishes of the local people. I am dismayed at some of the tactics being used by FHDC in keeping information from the electorate as well as apparently overstating the costs of the sports centre development at Nicholls quarry. If the development were to be granted planning permission there is no overriding need to move the road as the proposed buildings could be served from the existing road. It is therefore not necessary for it to be stopped up and realigned for this development to take place. The whole development is to the detriment of locals with no account of their view being taken at all.

I include this submission in that statement.

I would like to request that this stopping up order to be considered by the Secretary of State at the same time as the planning application so that he may see the full picture.

The closure of the road will affect my way of life as I use it en route to Hythe frequently. I have already raised my concerns over the impact of this proposed road next to the canal would have.
