I have been made aware that, to support their own planning application, Folkestone and Hythe District Council (previously Shepway DC) have applied for a road stopping order to be applied to Princes Parade, Hythe, Kent under the terms of section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

I wish to object in the strongest possible terms to this proposal.

Folkestone and Hythe District Council's plans for development of Princes Parade will cause massive, permanent harm to both the amenity of this area and the Grade 1 listed Royal Military Canal which runs adjacent to their proposed site.

There is widespread local opposition to these plans. However, even if the development is granted planning permission there is no overriding need to divert the road as the proposed development could be easily served by the existing road. Please note that the area in question currently supports the Seapoint Canoe Centre and a very popular car parking area which is in constant use by people wishing to walk in the peace and tranquillity offered by the Royal Military Canal path. It has never been suggested that Princes Parade needed to be stopped in support of these users.
