I have read in our local paper of the proposed stopping up of Princes Parade in Hythe prior to the proposed development. I feel very strongly that any inconvenience suffered by the prospective developers is considerably outdone by the inconvenience to local people who use this route for getting to and from work, myself included. And people avoiding the busy main road and roadworks.

Confidence in Folkestone and Hythe District Council (Shepway before £10,000 rebranding) is at an all time low. The moving of parking meters (another £10,000) weeks after they were installed did not help. This planning application has not been approved yet and the opposition is large.
