I should like to object to the proposed stopping up of Princes Parade for several reasons:

- 1) it is an unspoilt stretch of road that allows a view of the sea and easy parking and access to the sea for the disabled, families, fishermen, and families who are able to experience a tranquil view of the sea and use of the beach
- 2) it provides a speedy alternative to the busy main road for emergency service vehicles and as such can potentially save lives
