I object to the stopping up of the road because:

- I am one of many people who in the past have experienced difficulties, even in the case of minor developments, such as the erection of a shed, because of its proximity (9 metres) to the canal, an ancient monument.

-I now find that the council, so zealous in the past in its protection of said monument, with breathtaking hypocrisy, see no problem in the building of a road next to the canal.

-Their proposed development will be hugely detrimental, but if planning permission were given for it to go ahead, there would be no need to move the road.

>>> One of the many joys of this beautiful area is the ease with which it is possible to move between walking (or cycling) on the seafront, with its views of Dungeness and France (on a clear day) and the canal, with its cool dappled shade. This is made possible by using one of several established pathways along the route. The new development could similarly be reached from the seafront, meaning the road need not be diverted, for it to go ahead.

Also, please can the stepping up order be considered by the Secretary of State at the same time as the planning application, so that the full picture can be seen and considered.
