Please find my objection below to the following 'Stopping Up & Diversion of Highways', reference NATTRAN/SE/S247/3254.

I oppose the proposed development to the road at Princes Parade. My reasons for this are:

- the significant risk of harm to the Royal Military Canal and its historical value as a scheduled ancient monument if the road is moved closer to it.
- the significant risk to the setting of the area and the wildlife that currently exists on the site
- the increased noise, fumes and light pollution to nearby residents in Seabrook/ Hythe as the road will be closer to them.
- concerns over safety with the proposed road with the introduction of tight corners. Many users being children and families who will be at higher risk (my own daughter included who regularly accesses the playground and beach).
- concerns of denser traffic/ on Seabrook Road (as currently the direct Princes Parade Road to Hythe helps alleviates traffic issues, particularly during rush hour/ school time), especially near Seabrook Primary School where my daughter attends. So also an increased risk of safety issues on that road.
- reduction of parking near to the seafront resulting in lack of parking in surrounding areas, including near to my house on Hospital Hill and Seabrook Primary School.
- the lack of requirement to move the road for the Princes Parade development to take place as the current road provides the necessary access. In turn, also the unnecessary use of public funds to support the change of road.
