Enquiries Regarding Financial Support

If someone has recently arrived and is making an enquiry as to what financial assistance is possible or how to start work, help can be accessed as detailed below.

Enquiries Regarding Accessing Health Services

In the UK it is free for people to see a doctor. If you ever need hospital treatment this is also free.

Local Doctors (GPs)

As soon as possible you should register with a local doctor (also known as a General Practitioner - GP). All the family should visit your GP as soon as you can so that health checks can be carried out, you can access appropriate wrap around health services and, if needed, referrals to specialists can be made.

Everyone has a right to register with a GP and you do not need proof of address, immigration status, ID or an NHS number (you may be asked to provide ID but it is not a requirement). Advice on your nearest practice can be found at the following link:

USEFUL CONTACTS FOR THOSE ENQUIRING ABOUT ENTRY TO UK -

Information provided by the Refugee Council

You are a Ukrainian living in the UK and would like to claim asylum

Although each person's asylum case is assessed on its merits, the UK government currently considers that the Ukraine government is capable of protecting its citizens. Therefore the grounds for claiming asylum as a Ukrainian national are currently very narrow. Read here for more information. This may change depending on how the situation unfolds over the coming days and weeks.

You need an immigration advisor to support you to produce a strong claim and to understand your options if your claim has been refused or you face removal. The organisations on this list can provide you with help to understand your options and access a legal representative.

If you are destitute you can contact Refugee Council Infoline on 0808 196 7272 to access support services in your area. The Infoline is a live national freephone line open Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays between 9.30am and 12.30pm.

You are unable to contact family in Ukraine

The British Red Cross provides an International Family Tracing service. If your relatives are not answering normal communications such as telephone, email or mobile, British Red Cross may be able to help. Visit the International Family Tracing Service webpage and search for your nearest British Red Cross tracing service. Contact them and tell them you would like to contact a family member.
