### Agenda Item 3

#### **Declarations of Interest**

#### **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest (DPI)**

Where a Member has a new or registered DPI in a matter under consideration they must disclose that they have an interest and, unless the Monitoring Officer has agreed in advance that the DPI is a 'Sensitive Interest', explain the nature of that interest at the meeting. The Member must withdraw from the meeting at the commencement of the consideration of any matter in which they have declared a DPI and must not participate in any discussion of, or vote taken on, the matter unless they have been granted a dispensation permitting them to do so. If during the consideration of any item a Member becomes aware that they have a DPI in the matter they should declare the interest immediately and, subject to any dispensations, withdraw from the meeting.

#### Other Significant Interest (OSI)

Where a Member is declaring an OSI they must also disclose the interest and explain the nature of the interest at the meeting. The Member must withdraw from the meeting at the commencement of the consideration of any matter in which they have declared a OSI and must not participate in any discussion of, or vote taken on, the matter unless they have been granted a dispensation to do so or the meeting is one at which members of the public are permitted to speak for the purpose of making representations, answering questions or giving evidence relating to the matter. In the latter case, the Member may only participate on the same basis as a member of the public and cannot participate in any discussion of, or vote taken on, the matter and must withdraw from the meeting in accordance with the Council's procedure rules.

#### **Voluntary Announcement of Other Interests (VAOI)**

Where a Member does not have either a DPI or OSI but is of the opinion that for transparency reasons alone s/he should make an announcement in respect of a matter under consideration, they can make a VAOI. A Member declaring a VAOI may still remain at the meeting and vote on the matter under consideration.

#### Note to the Code:

Situations in which a Member may wish to make a VAOI include membership of outside bodies that have made representations on agenda items; where a Member knows a person involved, but does not have a close association with that person; or where an item would affect the well-being of a Member, relative, close associate, employer, etc. but not his/her financial position. It should be emphasised that an effect on the financial position of a Member, relative, close associate, employer, etc OR an application made by a Member, relative, close associate, employer, etc would both probably constitute either an OSI or in some cases a DPI.

#### 12. **Declarations of interest**

There were no declarations of interest.

#### 13. Minutes

The minutes of the meeting held on 25 November 2019 were approved and signed by the Chairman subject to the following amendment:

Minute item 10 refers to Royal Military Road, this should be Royal Military Avenue and Military Road.

Update notes from previous meeting:

Sea Wall, Dymchurch – There is an all year parking restriction (DYL) at this area as agreed with Dymchurch Parish Council. Other parts of Dymchurch are covered by part year restrictions.

Cherry Garden Lane – there have been various incidences where lorries have hit the traffic lights at this junction. There seems to be constant confusion at this junction. It may be that CCTV needs to be monitored and evaluated to check safety aspects. James Bowen referred this onto Damien Cocks (KCC)

who believes the problem to be driver error. A suggestion to install removable railings at the traffic lights has been made

Councillor Whybrow raised the question of allocation of items to the Highway Works Programme, siting an example of the TRO planned at Prospect Road in Hythe. He reiterated the HWP should include 'works in the pipeline' rather than just 'works completed'.

#### 14. Proposed Parking Restrictions 2020

Report JTB/19/06 by the Folkestone & Hythe District Council Highway Engineer was presented to members.

During the year parking restrictions had been proposed to the council. The report outlined the areas where restrictions would help to improve traffic flow, safety margins and resolve parking problems.

#### **RESOLVED:**

#### 15. **Highway Forward Works Programme**

Report JTB/19/07 updated members on the identified schemes approved for construction.

Members noted the following:

- Appendix B Drainage. Stockham Lane at Swingfield. This lane was closed for some time, James Bowen will provide an update.
- Appendix C- Street lighting. At Castle Hill Avenue there are two lamps to be replaced. Mr Bowen to look into this.
- Hammonds Corner funding could be looked at from EDF (Dungeness Power Station) and Lydd Airport.
- Dover Hill (Folkestone to Capel) speed reduction in place to 40mph and a suggestion made to add in a cycle lane, the arrester bed improvements include drainage works to prevent flooding. Councillor Whybrow has asked to see the designs and plans which Mr Bowen will arrange.
- Installation of maintenance bays. These are funded by lane rental at a
  county wide level. Members agreed that this information should be
  publicised as public perception is that general road improvements are
  more important. It was suggested a briefing note is provided to
  members.
- Cycle Routes further schemes are awaiting funding. It was noted that
  previous phases were funded by S106 monies, however new funding
  sources now need to be identified. Phase 5 from Nickolls Road to
  Dymchurch Redoubt runs alongside MOD land and the Army have
  requested acoustic fencing for this phase at an approximate cost of £1M.

- Ashley Avenue, Cheriton new entrance to private housing development with removal of DYL. Paul Thompson advised this is due for consultation in March 2020.
- Appendix I Combined member grant programme update. Dunes Road, redesign of traffic island, funding is in place. This junction redesign will help greatly with all bus turnings. Stade Street, West Parade, St Leonards Road, Portland Road and surrounding side roads in Hythe installation of 20mph zone, Councillor Whybrow confirmed funding provided by Hythe Town Council from CIL monies.

#### **RESOLVED:**

Prior to the closure of this meeting, members made the following comments:

- An email has been received from a resident to Cllr Mrs Ann Berry regarding cyclists riding dangerously from Links Way to Cherry Gardens.
- The junction at Weymouth Road and Richmond Street in Cheriton was reported as dangerous due to inconsiderate parking and lack of vision.
- Looking outside of the district the new Junction 10a in Ashford is problematical, with poor signage, inadequate lighting, indirect access to the William Harvey Hospital and confusing exits to A20 and M20. Mr Bowen remarked that this junction is the responsibility of Highways England.

On a final note, members congratulated staff at KCC along with multi-agency partners in dealing with the severe storms recently encountered. Mr Bowen elaborated that staff have been working extremely hard dealing with fallen trees, road traffic accidents and flooding, as well as many other issues due to the weather.

#### 1. Introduction

During the year parking restrictions have been proposed to the council. This report outlines the areas where restrictions would help to improve traffic flow, safety margins and resolve parking problems.

#### 2. Motorcycle Parking

#### 2.1 High Street (Sandgate) Map 1

Requests from parish council to install motorcycle bay by existing echelon car parking bays.

#### 3. Waiting Restrictions (Double Yellow Lines)

#### 3.1 Tudor Road (Cheriton)

A request form residents to have DYL along the northern kerbline to help keep footway and access for refuse vehicles/deliveries.

#### 3.2 Prospect Road (Sandgate)

A request for DYL corner protection from KCC Steward to be installed by junction with Sandgate Esplanade to prevent vehicles parking on footway at junction mouth.

#### 3.3 Morehall Avenue (Cheriton)

At the junction with Surrenden Road there are existing corner protections on the south side but not the north. Therefore request is to mirror southern kerb protection on the northern side.

#### 3.4 Canterbury Road (Lyminge)

Request from Parish Council and agreement from KCC Stewards to install DYL on existing SYL to help flow of traffic near village shops.

#### 3.4 Coast Drive (Lydd on Sea)

Additional DYL sections from Williamson Road to the corner by The Pilot public house allowing some staggered parking but therefore areas to pull in and allow traffic to pass safely and stop larger vehicles such as buses mounting the footway.

#### Cont.

The sections of DYL and parking areas will be approximately 30/35 metres each in length. There will be small variations on this where sections meet existing DYL

opposite junctions and at bus stops. I am unable to produce a map for this item at present.

#### 4. Motorhome Overnight Ban

#### 4.1 Sandgate Esplanade (Sandgate)

A request from Cllr Prater for same overnight motorhome ban as in Radnor Cliff area to eliminate antisocial parking/disturbances associated with camping in this area.

#### 4.2 Godwyn Road (Folkestone)

A request from Residents for overnight motorhome ban to eliminate antisocial parking/disturbances associated with camping in this area.

#### 5. Recommendations

- 5.2 Traffic Regulation Orders are made or amended for the above proposals in the Autumn/Winter 2020. Before a TRO is made, the regulations require statutory consultations with all affected persons.








#### 1. Introduction

This report provides an update and summarises schemes that have been programmed for delivery in 2020/21

Kent County Council has agreed a substantial increase in the budget for planned highway works over the next three years, and as a result we are still in the process of identifying and designing schemes for inclusion in our full Year One to Two (2020/21 and 2020/21) and Year Three to Five (2021/22 to 2023/24) programmes. Because of this, we have decided to publish an interim programme, and to publish the full programmes later this year. For some assets this interim programme covers approximately the first six months of 2020/21, whilst for others it includes most of the works planned for the whole year.

This programme is subject to regular review and may change for a number of reasons including budget allocation, contract rate changes, and to reflect KCC's changing priorities. The programme and extent of individual sites within the programme may also be revised following engineering assessment during the design phase.

#### **Local Growth Fund**

#### Local Growth Fund programme update for the Folkestone & Hythe District.

The Department for Transport (DfT) added £100m to the Local Growth Fund (LGF) pot in order to fund Local Sustainable Transport Fund Style schemes. KCC subsequently submitted four Local Sustainable Transport Fund (LSTF) capital bids 1) East Kent – A network for Growth, 2) Kent Thameside – Integrated door-to-door journeys and 3) West Kent – Tackling Congestion. The fourth was for Tonbridge Town Centre Regeneration, which included a highway improvements scheme in the Lower High Street as well as additional LSTF style measures. The objective of all the capital bids is to boost economic growth by decreasing carbon emissions and reducing congestion.

The Kent Thameside, West Kent and Tonbridge Town Centre Regeneration bids were all successful. The schemes aim to:

- improve access to employment and services
- · reduce the need to travel by the private car
- · enhance pedestrian, cycle and public transport facilities
- improve sustainable transport connections
