Thank you for above notification of the Proposal Notice for amendment 3 of the LGV Ban in two roads in your district.

Roads in Folkestone

STANBURY CRESCENT

The RHA has no objection to the proposed amendment to prohibit overnight parking for vehicles over 7.5 tonnes in Stanbury Crescent.

DOVER HILL (B2011)

The RHA strongly objects to the proposed amendment to further restrict vehicles over 7.5 tonnes from parking in the lay-by on Dover Hill . The current sign is ambiguous as it does not stipulate what constitutes 'overnight', which we understand is being addressed with the amendment. However, with limited places for drivers to take their 45 minute rest breaks additional restrictions being proposed to prevent the use of this lay-by on Saturdays and Sundays during the day and overnight – 7 days a week - is a safety and welfare issue. More and better provision should be provided not less as drivers have to take statutory breaks by law.

Subject: Prohibition of Parking Notice Dover Hill Folkestone (B2011)

Dear Sirs, my name is [REDACTED] and my bungalow's side and rear elevations are very close to the lay-by on Dover Hill, so consequently I have been subjected to excessive noise disturbance by Foreign Refrigerated Lorries parking in that layby overnight for nearly 6 years and after contacting both yourselves and KCC (Officers and Councillors) on numerous occasions this situation still remains to this day. When I have confronted some of the drivers explaining that they cannot park there overnight I have suffered verbal and threats of physical abuse. To date the sign that was put there indicating no overnight parking was at first ignored, then removed and disposed of just like all the others I notice in the district.

So whilst I absolutely welcome any measures that you are putting in place to stop this happening in the future with your plans for a prohibition Notice, I do have some reservations which I would now like to put to you and hope you can answer for me.

Fact....Foreign Lorry drivers do not care about Prohibition Notices and or signs and completely ignore and then remove them....Why should this latest effort be and different? Is the sign going to be of such a design that it cannot be removed or turned to face the other way like so many others currently in our district?? When is the sign going to be installed?? Surely this could be done immediately as currently it is a free for all out there and the posts are still there which held the last sign, so it shouldn't be a difficult installation.

I asked for this layby to have bollards to restrict it to smaller vehicles only to ensure it is not abused....Why is this not possible??

We have had no patrols at all in the past here to stop these drivers. I am the only one confronting them, so my poor wife who works 12 hour shifts in a care home can get some sleep at night, and I was threatened with violence on more than one occasion. I phoned your environmental health department, KCC and the Police, yet nobody wanted to get involved. Are there going to be night patrols who will confront these drivers and move them on??

Is there going to be a manned 24 hour phone number supplied so members of the public can report such illegal parking to get action taken immediately, so residents can have unrestricted sleep??

I am at the end of my tether with this issue, so unless I can get some positive responses and actions from you after a 6 year wait, I will be forced to highlight my misery to the local press and BBC South East Cameras, which I was just about to do before Councillor Pascoe sent me a copy of your Prohibition Notice.

I await your detailed responses with interest.
